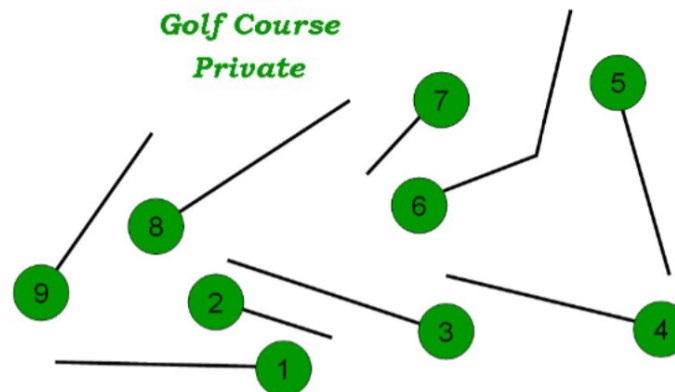

Casual play began in 1898 with a short track of holes that circled the Granliden hotel. In 1907 the course was expanded by Mr. A.H. Findlay. Then, in 1925, the prestigious golf designer Walter J. Travis redesigned the course yet again, providing the track that exists today.

Lateral Hazards and Out of Bounds

- Hole 1. Out of bounds over white stakes along road. Lateral hazard over red stakes on right of fairway and behind green.
- Hole 3. Lateral hazard over red stakes on right of fairway.
- Hole 4. Out of bounds over white stakes along road. Lateral hazard over red stakes on right of fairway and green. Ball in brook, drop behind brook, 1 stroke penalty.
- Hole 5. Out of bounds over white stakes on right.
- Hole 6. Lateral hazard over red stakes on right of fairway.
- Hole 8. Out of bounds over white stakes or wall on right. Lateral hazard over red stakes along brook on right.
- Hole 9. Out of bounds over white stakes on right beyond woods and along the houses. Ball in pond, 1 stroke penalty, drop beyond pond.

Additional Course Rules

- When players are on both the second and third tees, those on the second tee should allow those on the third tee to hit first. On the seventh and eighth tees, those on the eighth tee should hit first.
- Those wishing to start play on other than the first tee may do so only if the hole in back of them is open.
- Slow moving players must allow faster moving groups to play through provided the hole in front of the slower moving group is open.
- No playing groups shall exceed four in number.
- The golf course shall not be used for sunbathing, walking dogs, bicycle riding, Frisbee throwing, baseball, football, or any other non-golfing activity including a shortcut to the beach
- Keep all golf carts and hand carts off greens and tees.
